#### Bulletin 2024-95

The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) has approved and extended without change ETA Form 671 and ETA Form 9039. The new expiration date for ETA Form 671 and ETA Form 9039 is July 31, 2027. #### Circular 2020-03 & Circular 2020-04

The <u>Veterans in Effective Apprenticeship Act of 2019</u> included the implementation of certain requirements by the U.S. Department of Labor. Section 2(b)(3) of the Act requires that, when a Registered Apprenticeship Program is approved by OA or an SAA, a copy of the program's certificate of registration must be provided to the State Approving Agency in the state where the program is located. In response to section 2(b)(3) of the Act, OA developed a process within RAPIDS for transmittal of new program Registration Certificates to appropriate VA State Approving Agencies, with an additional copy of the program Registration Certificate sent to the VA.

For SAAs utilizing RAPIDS, this feature can be added for you by request via <a href="mailto:rapids.help@dol.gov">rapids.help@dol.gov</a>. For SAAs utilizing systems other than RAPIDS, please ensure this process has been adopted. More details regarding OA and SAA obligations from the Veterans in Effective Apprenticeship Act of 2019 can be found in <a href="mailto:Circular 2020-04">Circular 2020-04</a>.

Additionally, contact information for all State Approving Agencies can be located in the <u>NASAA database</u> and registered apprenticeship programs that have current VA approval for veterans benefits can be found in the <u>WEAMS Look Up Tool</u>.

#### 2024 WANTO Grant

USDOL's Women's Bureau is awarding \$6 million to nine organizations that will prepare women for preapprenticeship, apprenticeship and nontraditional careers under the <a href="Women in Apprenticeship and Nontraditional Occupations">Women in Apprenticeship and Nontraditional Occupations</a> (WANTO) grant program.

Congratulations to awardees in 9 states:
Arkansas, Arizona, California, Maryland, Nevada, Ohio,
Pennsylvania, Texas, Vermont - and Washington, DC to
train women for good jobs in fields like construction,
advanced manufacturing and IT. This year there was a
119% increase in WANTO applications!

#### **Workforce Pathways for Youth**

The U.S. Department of Labor today announced the availability of up to \$20 million in grants for national out-of-school time organizations to expand local work-based learning opportunities, job training and career pathways for underserved youth after school and during the summer.

The <u>Workforce Pathways for Youth</u> demonstration grants will help these organizations partner with state or locally operated affiliate organizations to serve historically marginalized and underserved youth, ages 14 to 21.

#### **Senior Community Service Employment Program**

The U.S. Department of Labor today announced the award of \$18.4 million in demonstration grants to nine current national grantees operating a <u>Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP)</u> grant so the department can measure the effectiveness of industry or sector-based training as a bridge to unsubsidized employment for low-income, older workers.

The demonstration grants will allow recipients to build and expand partnerships with employers, training providers and the public workforce system to inform and support their projects. Grantees will augment their current service model with a combination of enhanced career navigation services, occupational and on-the-job training.

## REGULATORY AGENDA & CONGRESSIONAL UPDATES

#### **UPDATE: National Apprenticeship System Enhancements**

On January 17, 2024, the Office of the Federal Register published the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM) titled National Apprenticeship System Enhancements, which would update the regulations at 29 CFR part 29 addressing labor standards of apprenticeship and the governance of the National Apprenticeship System. The NPRM also proposes technical and conforming adjustments to the current text of 29 CFR part 30. The NPRM received 2,115 comments through the 61-day comment period which ended on March 18, 2024. As of October 1st, no effective date has been announced the proposed rule. The NPRM may be accessed through the Federal e-Rulemaking portal at: Federal Register: National Apprenticeship System Enhancements.
