National Apprenticeship Week 2024

Thank you for celebrating the 10th anniversary of National Apprenticeship Week (NAW) with us! With your partnership, we had a record-breaking 1580 apprenticeship events and nearly 900 proclamations. Your hard work in showcasing the transformative power of Registered Apprenticeships has made a positive impact throughout the country.

In response to stakeholder feedback, NAW is moving to the Spring! To help with the transition, there will be a single National Apprenticeship Day for 2025, and we will be resuming the week-long celebration of NAW in 2026. Please note the NAW dates for the next four years:

<u>April 30, 2025</u> – National Apprenticeship Day April 26 through May 2, 2026 – National Apprenticeship Week April 25 through May 1, 2027 – National Apprenticeship Week April 23 through April 29, 2028 – National Apprenticeship Week

National Apprenticeship System Enhancements



The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM) for National Apprenticeship System Enhancements introduced in January 2024, have been withdrawn as of December 27, 2024. By withdrawing the proposed rule, the Department is eliminating the pending nature of this rulemaking. The Department intends to engage with all interested parties to discuss and consider future enhancements and impacts for the quality and expansion of registered apprenticeship and the roles and responsibilities of stakeholders in the National Apprenticeship System. REGISTRATION AGENCY TOOLS & SUPPORT

Registration of Apprenticeship Programs and Apprentices for Tribal Governments and Instrumentalities

On December 2, 2025, the Office of Apprenticeship issued new guidance clarifying the eligibility of tribal entities or any instrumentalities of the tribes to serve as sponsors of registered apprenticeship programs and their eligibility to be registered by OA or an SAA with availability of exemptive relief from certain federal regulatory requirements. Framework for Preparing and Infrastructure Workforce

On December 30th, 2024, USDOL's Employment and Training Administration issued <u>Change 1 to Training and</u> <u>Employment Notice No. 08-22: Building Pathways to Infrastructure Careers - Framework for Preparing and</u> <u>Infrastructure Workforce.</u> The change promotes a framework for all workforce stakeholders, including infrastructure project leads, to engage the public workforce system in implementing the Investing in America (IIA) funding with strong workforce commitments and proven strategies that produce high-quality education, training, and employment opportunities for all workers. This update also includes several examples of registered apprenticeship opportunities for coordination with the public workforce system.

State Apprenticeship Agency Obligations

<u>Circular 2023-02</u> outlines the roles and responsibilities of State Apprenticeship Agencies (SAA) to retain recognition as an approved registration agency. This includes submission of modifications to state apprenticeship law, registration agency changes, data reporting requirements, apprenticeability of occupations, and reciprocity. Additionally, <u>Circular 2023-02A</u> offers a self-assessment tool for which SAAs may utilize to conduct periodic evaluations of conformity with requirements outlined in 29 CFR Parts 29 and 30. SAAs are encouraged to review these helpful resources in advance of an SAA review.

RAPIDS Changes

RAPIDS helpdesk email has been changed to <u>apprenticeship.ithelp@oa.dol.gov</u>. Effective 12/20/2024 at 6PM EST apprenticeship.ithelp@dol.gov will no longer be active and Helpdesk will not be able to receive email for up to an hour during the transition.

New Apprenticeable Occupations

The Office of Apprenticeship approved 16 new apprenticeable occupations in 2024 including Game Designer, Real Estate Sales Agent, Nanotechnology Engineering Technician, and Anesthesia Technologist. GRANT AWARDS

Women in Apprenticeship & Non-Traditional Occupations Grant

U.S. DOL announced the award of <u>\$6 million in funding to help recruit, train, and retain more women</u> in quality pre-apprenticeship and RA programs, as well as in nontraditional occupations. The Women in Apprenticeship and Nontraditional Occupations (WANTO) grants will enable organizations in eight states and D.C. to provide training programs in fields where women are traditionally underrepresented, such as construction, advanced manufacturing, energy, technology, and transportation. Region 6 captured 3 of those grants:
